

Repealing Preemption: Lessons Learned

2019: UNPRECEDENTED NUMBER OF BILLS FILED AND PASSED

Colorado:

- HB 1210, the "Local Wage Option" bill, allows localities to decide their own minimum wage.
- HB 19-1033 allows localities to tax and regulate cigarettes and other tobacco products.
- SB 19-181 gives local governments control over the approval of drilling sites; forces the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission to prioritize public health and the environment

Arkansas:

HB 2033 repealed parts of the state law preempting municipal broadband





LESSONS:

- Legal review must be the first step.
- Connect repeal of preemption with an affirmation of city power.
- Be prepared to fight on two fronts: local control and the issue that is presently preempted
- Provide data, maps and other tools that make the case for deciding the issue at the local level.
- Educate, Educate, Educate.
- Build broader cross issue coalitions, including partners from across the political spectrum.





2020 REPEAL BILLS:

- Broadband: FL, NC, TN, PA
- Minimum Wage: FL, KY, LA, NY, PA
- Plastics: CO, FL, MN
- Rent Regulation: CO, FL, IL, PA


Capacity Needed for Preemption Repeals

2019 Preemption Repeal Bills Introduced (Not Yet Passed)




Is Repealing Statutory Language Enough? Some questions to consider:

• Which local governments will have default power?

• Will local governments be subject to implied preemption challenges?

• What will happen if <u>both a county and a city</u> within a county adopt a local law?

• What tools will be available for local enforcement?



A Few Recommendations

Specify Which Local Governments Will Have Authority To Adopt Local Laws

Clarify If Voters Will Be Able To Adopt Local Laws Through Local Initiative Powers

Specify, If Necessary, How Overlapping County and City Laws Will Interact

Consider Specifically Listing Key Enforcement Powers









How Did Colorado's HB 19-1210 Tackle These Issues?

01

Defined local government as meaning: a city; town; territorial charter city; city and county; or home rule county.

02

Expressly allowed local voters to enact local minimum wage laws through initiative powers, when available.

03

Expressly allows for intergovernmental agreements. Also respected default relationship between counties and their incorporated versus unincorporated areas.

04

Incorporated best practices for minimum wage enforcement by expressly authorizing key enforcement tools, such as: liquidated damages; costs and attorneys fees; private right of action.
